Registration Open for K-State Junior Producer Days The 2024 K-State Junior Producer Day dates are now open for registration. The K-State Junior Beef Producer Day will be Saturday, March 2, with K-State Junior Sheep Producer Day scheduled for Saturday, March 16. Both events will be hosted in Weber Arena on the K-State campus in Manhattan. These are one-day educational events for families to learn more about the selection and management of a specific species. Youth, adults, project leaders, and volunteers of all ages and skill levels are invited to attend! Presentations will be provided by K-State faculty, staff, students, extension agents, former exhibitors, and guest speakers. Topics will range from selection to nutrition, to meat science, reproduction, health, clipping and grooming, and showmanship. This is a family learning event! Everyone who plans to attend must register, including both youth and adults. For both events, the cost is \$20/person by the deadline, or \$25 after the deadline. Only those who register by the appropriate deadline will receive a t-shirt. Junior Beef Producer Day registrations are due February 12, with Junior Sheep being due by February 26. Registration is open now and can be completed online using this link: http://bit.ly/ksuasiregister. Junior Producer Day event registrations are non-refundable.



Let's set some age appropriate goals!

Below I have written a goal for a junior, intermediate, and a senior all in the same project. Notice how there are different types of goals for each age level.

Junior

I would like to walk my bucket calf 3 times a week to make sure she is halter-broke before weigh-in.

I would like to learn two new brush strokes and use them both in a painting.

Intermediate

I would like to attend two clipping workshops to improve my clipping skills before the fair.

I would like to attend two pottery classes a week to improve my shaping skills.

Senior

I would like to present at a project meeting about one specific dipping technique to help younger 4-Hers.

I would like to become a Junior Project leader in the Visual Arts project and help assist the Project Leader with lessons.

Focus on learning the basics of the project.

Focus on improving your skills in the project and starting to take on some leadership roles.

Focus on leadership and mastering skills in your project.

A good rule of thumb is three to five goals per project for ages 7 to 10, four to eight goals per project for ages 11 to 13, and 7 to 12 goals per project for ages 14 to 18.

All T-Shirt Designs must be turned into the Extension office by 5:00 pm on February 15, 2024. All t-shirt designs will be checked for copyright infringement and design criteria approval. Any design brought to County Club Day without approval will not be allowed to compete in the contest.
